Grace and peace to you from God our Father and from our Lord Jesus Christ. Amen.

Even though I am not able to serve as your pastor during this time, I know that you are wondering how I am doing. First of all, I miss all of you and wish I could be back. As you know all the symptoms I had two years ago have come back and I even have symptoms I didn't have the first time. I have had a couple of weeks to rest, but the time off has not helped heal me. I have been receiving IV treatments which have been effective in the past. However the last treatment did not help me. I am having another IV treatment this week so I pray this one will help me maybe just a little.

I have met with my primary care doctor, and he has recommended two additional kinds of treatment. This first week in December I will be having consultations to set up a new treatment plan while continuing with the treatments I am already receiving. It is a very frustrating time for me, especially not knowing when my health will improve, but I am trying to be patient.

On a positive note, I am really enjoying being able to worship with my dad at Maine Presbyterian Church on Sundays. It is a real treat for me to go to worship with my dad and Lola (his beloved service dog). Each Sunday I am greeted by Lola barking and jumping up to kiss my face. We often go out for lunch following worship. It will be very good for me to be able to be with my dad over the holidays in a way that I wouldn't have been able to do if I was actively serving as a pastor. There are blessings even in our weaknesses and disruptions. Please continue to pray for my dad and my family as we go through this first holiday season without my mom.

As you know, I have spent years studying Paul and the early church. During this season I take comfort in that Paul too had some kind of thorn in the flesh. We are never told what exactly it was, but it was something that humbled him and made serving as a leader more difficult. I am comforted that I am in good company and that God uses people who are struggling with health issues and with life to serve the church. Which is what I hope to continue to do.

During this time, I am praying for my health to improve, but I am also praying for you. It is an uncertain time, and I wish I could tell you exactly what will happen, but I am uncertain as to what will happen as well. I cling to these words of God during these times, "My grace is sufficient for you, for power is made perfect in weakness." During this time of weakness, I am thankful for the guidance and support you are receiving from the presbytery and the synod. I am thankful that you have a very capable interim to help you through this time. I am thankful that God is leading you and leading me into the future God already has for us, whatever that might be.

I will miss leading worship in Advent and Christmas but know that I am resting and seeking treatment and trying to take care of myself. Wishing all of you a blessed Advent season and Merry Christmas!

Four-letter words fill our vocabulary; Love is a four-letter word that should fill our hearts!

Four-letter words **have** a bad reputation. I can remember my older sister rebuking me by threatening to **tell** my mother **that** I **used** a **four**-letter word. If the truth be known, I **have** in my time used a variety of **four**-letter words. I frequently in my **life have used** the **word** "**work**", sometimes as a positive and sometimes as a negative.

There are a variety of **four**-letter words **that come** to **mind** which scream positive messages. These are words which define our Christian faith. These **four**-letter words are at our **very soul**. We **know that** Christ's church was built on the **Rock that** was Peter. We **know that** we are called to be **kind** to the least of these our brethren. We **know that** we are to spend our **time** in communion **with** God and attempt to **live** His **word**. We are to **pray** ceaselessly. At our **core** is our faith **that** Christ **died** for our **sins**. We should **look** at **each** of these words as a **gift from** our **Lord** and Savior Jesus the Christ. 1 Corinthians 13 tells us **that** the greatest gift is a **four**-letter word, "**Love**." You also worried about who got your name. From previous experience you knew which child gave the best gifts and which child gave stockings or handkerchiefs. You wanted to give a gift that was appreciated but you didn't want to give anyone the wrong impression about your feelings for them and you didn't want to get stockings! What if you drew the name of someone of the opposite gender. Would they think that you actually liked them? That could be a tragedy.

Looking back giving a Christmas present to a classmate was an act of love even if it was mandated. Christ calls us to love everyone. While that may seem a daunting task, that is what we are called to do! Those who are hardest to love, need love the most. I don't need to like someone or like what they are doing to love them in my heart. The Bible tells us that God the creator was consistently disappointed by His human creations. God certainly didn't always like what humans did / doesn't always like what we do. Yet God's love has NO limit! God had so much love that He sacrificed His Son so that we can spend eternity with Him in His heavenly kingdom. The song says "Love is a many splendored thing." It is, but Love is also a four-letter word. It is the reason behind God's greatest gift. Love came to life at Christmas!
