From the Pastor's Desk

"The gifts he gave were that some would be apostles, some prophets, some evangelists, some pastors and teachers, to equip the saints for the work of ministry, for building up the body of Christ."

Ephesians 4:11-12

Grace and peace to you from God our Father and from our Lord Jesus Christ. Amen.

It is the above verses which have been the inspiration behind the "Life of Faith Initiative." Rev. Dwight DuBois developed a presentation entitled the "Holy Innovations Project." We will be using these videos the second Sundays in worship. They were actually designed to be used in two hour small group meetings. We are going to take three worship services to present one session so it will be over the course of several months that we will receive and discuss this information.

In this model, all the baptized believers are the ministers of the church. It takes seriously the "priesthood of all believers", which is a doctrine that both of our denominations declare in various places, but we have not been good at actually living it out. In this model, the majority of ministry happens outside the walls of the church building. Look at Jesus' ministry for example. Yes, there are stories about Jesus in the temple or the synagogue, but where do most of the stories about Jesus take place? They take place in his daily life wherever he happens to be. His ministry was not restricted to a particular place or organization.

Yet we in the modern church have exclusively emphasized the ministry of a congregation to only include what happens inside the church along with the programming of the church. If we are truly the Body of Christ acting in the world, our ministry in our daily lives is just as important as our lives in the gathered community.

In this model the gathered church is still vitally important. The gathered church is to be a place where in the words of Ephesians pastors and teachers are "to equip the saints for the work of ministry, for building up the body of Christ." Pastors are to be equippers of the people so they can be sent out into the world to do the real work of ministry.

This is not a new program to be added to the life of the church. Instead it is claiming what we are already doing as ministry. We live in a very busy culture and the idea of adding something to our overbooked schedule is a hard ask, but instead what if we thought of everything we already do as ministry? Our work is ministry, school is ministry, spending time with your family is ministry, attending school activities is ministry, our leisure is ministry. It is not about adding something new, it is about understanding the connection between God and our daily lives.

God doesn't just call us to serve for one hour on Sunday morning, but God calls us to serve each and every hour of our lives through what we already do. We can love God and our neighbors each and every day wherever we are. The theme is "Trusting Jesus. Serving our neighbors." We do this out in our community and in our world. Let us be the hands and feet and mouth of Jesus each and every day. Thanks be to God!
